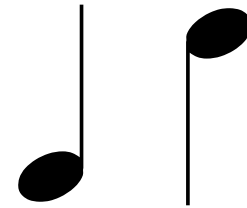
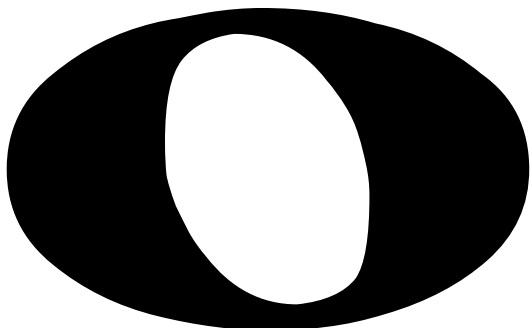
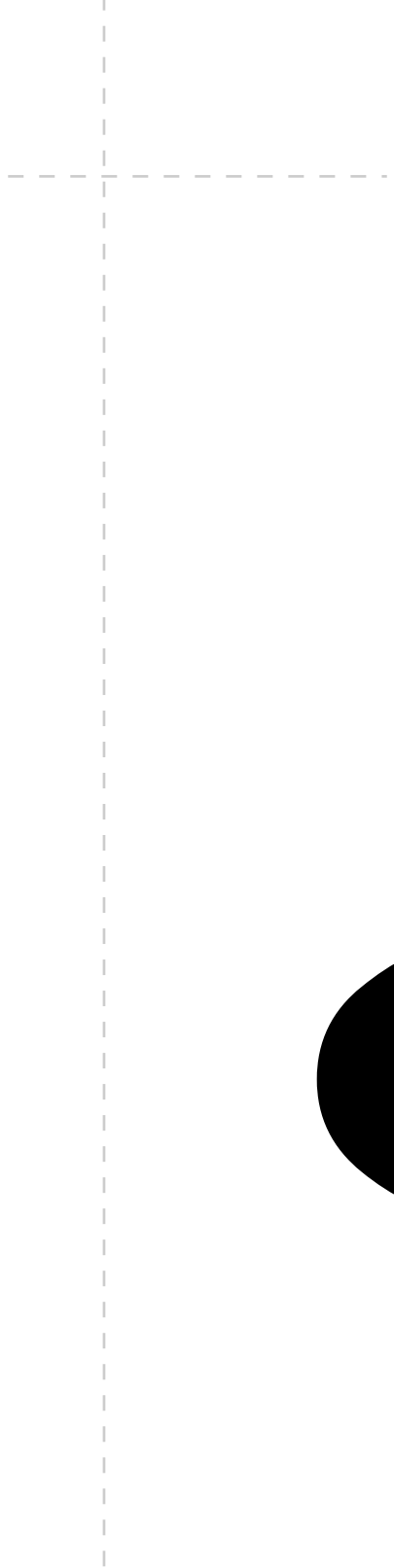
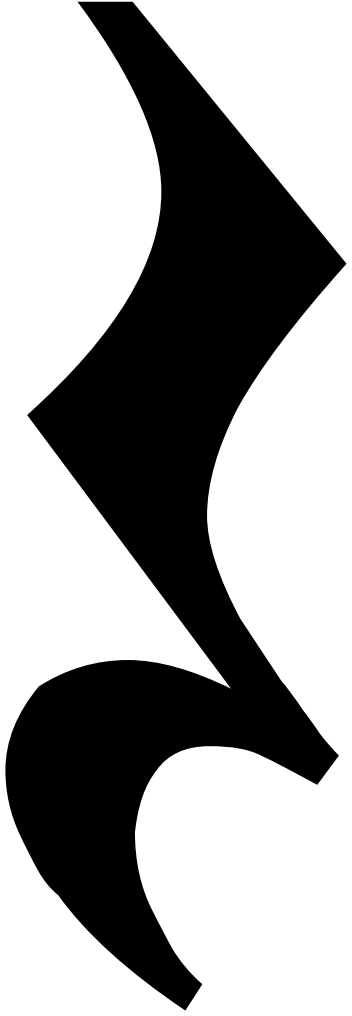
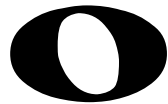


This is a half note.  
It has two beats. When  
playing a beat game,  
say “one two” before  
moving on.  
Notice that the notehead is  
not filled in. It is empty.  
The line is called a stem.  
Half notes can be right side up  
or upside down in music.



This is a quarter note.  
It has one beat. When  
playing a beat game,  
just say “one” and  
move on.  
That squished round part is  
called a note head. It  
looks more like a foot!  
That line is called a stem.  
Just think of a flower on  
top of its stem and you  
will remember the name.  
Quarter notes can be right side  
up or upside down in music.





This is a whole note  
and it gets four beats!  
It moves very slowly!

Play-stay-stay-stay!



This is a quarter rest.  
It means that you do not  
play anything.

When you see this....  
Shhhhh for one beat.
