My Tiny Right Hand

Cut unmarked sheet in half so each child receives a drawing of one right hand pointer. Show the children the color coded sheet(s) so they can mark their sheets.



If children are really young and do not color well, use stickers to mark the pink and blue fingers. For others, use crayons or markers.

Review each day until the children have no trouble remembering these two color codes and can take a sheet without the pink and blue colors and color code correctly with no help or tap their "pink" or "blue" finger when directed by the teacher.

(ie., "Tap your blue finger 3 times.")

Also let children take turns being the "teacher".

I recommend that you laminate your two color-coded sheets (or cut around the hand and laminate) and display them so the children are continually exposed to the color coding.
