My Tiny Right Hand





The directions for color coding 5 fingers is virtually identical to the directions for color coding 2 fingers!

Cut unmarked sheet in half so each child receives a drawing of one right hand pointer. Show the children the color coded sheet(s) so they can mark their sheets.

If children are really young and do not color well, use stickers to mark the finger colors. Or, if they are able, use crayons or markers.

Review each day until the children have no trouble remembering these color codes and can take a sheet without the colors and color code correctly with no help

Now play the "tap tap" game with all the fingers of the right hand. And again, let children take turns being the teacher.

I recommend that you laminate your two color-coded sheets (or cut around the hands and laminate) and display them so the children are continually exposed to the color coding.
