# Going to Tick Tock

So children have a means to get to Tick Tock without always asking for help, this chart can be attached to the computer monitor or tablet. The smaller charts can be made into personal bookmark size.

Cut apart, then trim sides and top about a quarter inch each side.

Put the 2 pieces into a 8 1/2 x 11 inch laminate pocket with equal space around each.

The bookmark sized charts can be put into bookmark size laminate pockets (ie. 2 3/8 x9) or trimmed and lined up within a 8 1/2x11 inch pocket.

Laminate, cut apart, curve square corners.
