

SUGGESTIONS/INFO

At this point students are still learning primarily with color coding. However this song introduces notation just so students start becoming used to using it in different ways. It may be a good time to introduce the Silly Song activities for learning to read music - starts with just Middle C, D and E.

The activity and info sheets are all only half pagers, so generally only one part will be appropriate at a given time. Very young students can learn names, beats, etc. well before they are ready to actually learn with the notation.

The notation is color coded. That coding will be gradually taken off, one bit at a time until no longer necessary.


The key strip type of keyboard drawings have keys the width of a mini keyboard so can be used for practicing. Fingers need to be able to function one at a time with ease. The hand should start to stay in position as well at this point.

Introduce the left hand with this song. It just goes up one finger at a time, so students can look at their hand as they move one key and finger at a time. Many need their fingers color coded with washable marker dots at this point. Also start "Walking" with both hands in unison - no sheets needed. Put hands in position and "walk", looking at the fingers.

Short instructions are on each sheet...hope that's enough at this point. Remember, there are YouTube videos on some of these subjects.

The notes we use in order to read music sit on top of 5 different lines or in the spaces between, above or below those 5 lines.


Lines 1 through 5 and spaces 1 through 4 are shown below.






Circle the correct number of beats in each box and say the name of the note. 3 3 4

Circle the space notes.




Now we see the rhythm of the song with notes, not beat boxes! Quarter note = 1 beat. Half note = 2 beats. Tap...Play







I AM WALKING UP TO G line 1




I AM WALKING UP TO G line 2




The whole song in real music notation!
Look at notes, tap song on keystrip.








Turn these half notes into quarter notes.




We saw this page already!
