

## **Anybody Can Play PIANO**

Flashcards for teaching notation.

Choose 2-3 notes to begin. Using several of each note, line them up on the music rack in random order to make a "Silly Song" to play.

Using the same notes, mix them up and play another "Silly Song". Do this multiple times until these notes are easily recognized and played on the keys.

Add another note to the mix and continue to play the "Silly Song" game.

These flashcards are centered so can be used right side up or upside down.

Clef signs can be interspersed so "Silly Songs" can jump from treble to bass clefs.

★ Cut flashcards apart on dotted lines.

I recommend they be laminated. If laminating, put 2 cards back to back - one with with dotted lines and the other with no lines - so they have "double duty". Do slightly glue them together before laminating to keep them in place.

FYI....I purchase from Laminator.com and use the "credit card" size 5mm, 2-1/8" x 3-3/8" laminating pouches for these little flashcards.

There are also self-sealing laminating pouches (2mm, I think) that are available in many stores and online if you do not wish to invest in a laminator. If you use these lighter weight, self-sealing pouches, laminate the entire sheet, then cut out the little cards.
