
TINY HANDS COLORED AND NUMBERED



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When playing with both hands, it is sometimes a good thing to have a little pair of laminted hands that are color coded as a reminder.

Fingering is also "on the horizon" so the fingering is shown and color coded to match the fingers. So if you are having the students play a simple little song with fingering, if finger 5 is blue, they know it is for the left hand.

Remind them fingering matches when palms of the hands touch - like when we clap our hands. The color coding matches "piggy back" to make playing the same thing with both hands at the same time much easier....same colors are touching same name keys.
